F. Sheriff Department

G. Friends of Wind Cave

1. Steve Baldwin appeared before the board to update the commission on the progress of the 266th Street Road Project. Baldwin stated that the Friends of Wind Cave had appeared before the commission about one year ago to request that the commission waive the requirement for a performance bond. The National Guard will provide the labor and equipment for the project and is currently working on the engineering plans. The group has raised funds to purchase the materials to be used for the project. The commission advised Baldwin to bring the completed engineering plans along with a statement from the National Guard to the commission stating that the National Guard will provide the labor and equipment to do the work and that the work will be done in compliance with county regulations. Once this is received, the commission would consider waiving the performance bond.

H. Auditor

- Motion by Hartman and seconded by Lintz to approve and authorize the chairman to sign the 2018 Revised Intergovernmental Contract with the South Dakota Public Assurance Alliance. Motion carried, unanimous. Attorney Kelley reminded the commission that the commissioner assigned to represent the county on this board has a duty to attend the meetings unless excused by the Chairman. If they have two absences without excuse within one calendar year, the Board of Directors for the alliance can replace them.
- 2. The commission reviewed Resolution 2004-09. The auditor will have all the departments look at the resolution and verify the hours of operation for their department. Once all the recommended changes have been made, the resolution will be revised and brought back to the commission for approval.
