

Custer County Conservation District Meeting Minutes – October 6, 2022

The October 6, 2022 meeting of the Custer County Conservation District was called to order in the Commissioner's Conference Room, Custer County Courthouse, at 9:02 AM by Paul Nettinga.

In attendance were Oonagh Wood, Paul Nettinga, Tamarah Caster, Greg Neugebauer, Stuart Adrian, Joel Milos, Laura Bosworth, Julie Wheeler, and Mike Baldwin.

All motions were approved unanimously unless otherwise noted. For the purpose of continuity, these minutes are not necessarily in chronological order.

The meeting minutes from September 8, 2022 and today's agenda were approved after a motion by Oonagh and a second by Tamarah, motion carried.

Partnership/Guest Reports:

- NRCS Representatives: Joel Milos Report attached
 - Additional notes:
 - Laura Bosworth was introduced as the new state level forester for NRCS.
- Buffalo Gap National Grassland: Julie Wheeler
 - o Grazing on the grassland was better than anticipated. Some water issues were encountered and accommodations were made.
 - o Received a request from Boy Scouts group in Rapid City to assist with bat boxes.
 - o Prairie dogs to be treated on 3-4 towns in Custer County.
 - Advertising for seasonal help for next year (2-3 positions). They were not able to hire seasonals this year.

- Forestry Management Plans by NRCS 11/17, 9:00-10:30, online. Laura Bosworth, SD NRCS State Forester will lead a training session on writing forestry management plans.

Old Business:

 - Conservation Commission fall grant application was submitted. Total requested was \$99,950, which included \$500 for administrative costs. Applications will be reviewed by the Commission in November.

- A new thinning grant cost-share application was received. Applicant is aware that we do not have funds at this time, but that we applied for a new grant with the State.
- Have not received an update on Matthew Piper's approved 1 ac thinning grant. Will need to follow up with forester.
- Joint Chiefs' Landscape Restoration Partnership proposal per Dave's request,
 Mike spoke with Justin Boerboom on possibility of a late submission. Justin said this was not possible.

Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP)

- 2018-2021: 6 Active Contracts
- 2022:
 - Forestry CIS: Funded two contracts for \$17,089 treating 25.1 acres total. Included Forest Stand Improvements and Woody Residue Treatment.
 - Range/Riparian CIS: Funded one contract for \$123,457 treating 3,395 acres. Included cross fencing, livestock shelter structure, shallow well/pump, livestock pipeline and stock tanks, prescribed grazing, and a stream crossing, streambank/shoreline protection, and exclusion fences along Battle Creek.

Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP)

- 2018-2022: 13 Active Contracts, additional 2 CSP-GCI
 - o 4 Contracts are in final year no renewals.
 - Working towards certifying enhancements/practices for FY22 needed applied by September 30th.
- FY23 CSP-GCI: Letter's have been mailed to those who may be eligible. Deadline to apply is October 14th, 2022.
