

Custer County Conservation District Meeting Minutes – June 8, 2023

The June 8, 2023 meeting of the Custer County Conservation District was called to order in the Basement Conference Room at the Custer County Courthouse, at 9:02 AM by Dave Thom.

In attendance were Dave Thom, Paul Nettinga, Tamarah Caster, Oonagh Wood, Greg Neugebauer (call-in), Stuart Adrian, Joel Milos, Patricia Weyrich, and Mike Baldwin.

All motions were approved unanimously unless otherwise noted. For the purpose of continuity, these minutes are not necessarily in chronological order.

Motion to approve today's agenda and the meeting minutes from April 13, 2023 was made by Paul, seconded by Tamarah, motion carried.

 - Joel also provided a news release of the open application period for the Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP).
- SD DANR RCF: Patricia Weyrich -
 - The person hired for the Hot Springs forester position was a no-show. They plan on re-flying the position. The Lead forester position is also vacant.
 - o Interns began work last week of May.
 - o Interviewing candidates for the Community Forester position in Pierre.
 - o Patricia provided information on upcoming webinars and forestry workshop:

- Tamarah let the Board know that former supervisor Jim Hughes passed away. His obituary was in this week's paper. Tamarah will get a card on behalf of the Board and will send it to his family.

Old Business: None

New Business:

- Soil health workshop:
 - Registration numbers are less than hoped. Mike placed an advertisement in the May 24th and 31st editions of the Custer Chronicle. Also advertised on CCCD website, Facebook, and newsletter. Postcards were sent to ~240 agricultural producers in eastern Custer county.
 - o Lunch will be catered. Sponsors are Millborn Seeds and Hefty Seeds.
- Conservation thinning grants:
 - o 2021-23 grant update:
 - Six-month grant extension request was approved at the April meeting of the Conservation Commission. Grant now runs through December 31.
 - Adrian project is complete, reimbursement request was submitted to the state.
 - Piper is withdrawing his project from the grant program. Work was done on the property, but not to specifications.
 - o 2022-24 grant landowner applications:

- Landowner applications with completed forest prescriptions and maps were summarized and presented for the Board to review. These were:
 - Rita Stuen -3 acre prescription, grant funds needed = \$975.00.
 - Mark Weimer 6.3 acre prescription, grant funds needed = \$2,047.50.
 - Sheldon Rasmussen, Jacks Ranch 50 acre prescription, grant funds needed = \$16,250.00.
 - If the Board approves all 3 applications, total acreage granted would be 59.3 aces and total funds needed to reserve is \$19,272.50. The remaining grant balance would be approximately 84 acres available. There is one other outstanding grant application that is waiting on a prescription before it can be reviewed by the Board. This application is for less than 10 acres. Therefore, it is Mike's recommendation to approve the three applications presented so that landowners can begin lining up contractors.
 - Motion made by Oonagh to approve applications by Stuen, Weimer, and Rasmussen as presented, second by Tamarah, motion carried.
- o Forest Health thinning grant:
 - Our grant was approved and we were awarded \$25,000 in cost-share for new thinning projects in the county. Grant expires on June 30, 2024.
 - No landowner applications at this time. Because this grant and the 2022-2024 grant both expire in June 2024, and because getting an extension on the forest health grant is much easier than the 2022-24 grant, Mike recommends expending all 2022-24 grant funds prior to spending towards the Forest Health grant. Board agrees to prioritize expenditure of 2022-24 funds over Forest Health grant.
 - Patricia noted that the Tony Seidl will assume her role in matters related to the Forest Health grant (e.g., site visits, writing forest prescriptions, certification of work completed, etc.).
- SDACD Hills Area meeting:
 - O Reminder that the meeting will be next Tuesday, June 13, at 2:00 PM in Rapid City at the Outdoor Campus. Mike would like at least one board member to attend. Dave and Paul said they will attend. Mike will also attend the Hills Area employee meeting that morning.

Other Business:

- Miscellaneous office manager updates:
 - o Arbor Day activities:
 - Tree give-away and plantings:
 - Trees were provided to 1st graders at Custer and Hermosa Elementary Schools. A larger tree was also planted at each school with assistance from the students and the school grounds keepers.

- Josh Larson, Community Forester with SD DANR, gave a presentation on Arbor Day at both events.
- Tamarah delivered trees to Elk Mountain School and spoke to the students about Arbor Day.
- Creative Writing Contest:
 - Millie Paulton was awarded honorable mention and received a \$20 cash prize and certificate. There were over 700 entries from students across the state. Mike presented Millie with her award at the school's end of year celebration at Elk Mountain School.
- o Newsletter:
 - The spring/summer newsletter was completed and distributed by mail/email. Mike also posted a digital copy on the website.
- SDACD Video Project Custer CCD thinning program:
 - The video is hosted on the USDA NRCS South Dakota YouTube channel. Links to the video have been posted on our website, Facebook page, and the SD Locally Led website (sdlocalconservation.org/news). Caitie Uthe, SDACD, sent a press release to a large audience. The press release was published in the May 17 edition of the Custer Chronicle.
 - Mike spoke to Blain Brakke, SDACD, about the potential to do short video. It might cost roughly \$1,000 to put it together since all the video shooting is complete. Would need to explore funding options. Patricia stated that SD Family Forests Association may have funding available.
- o Black Hills Resilient Forest Partnership meeting:
 - Upcoming meeting in Rapid City on June 14.
- o Forest Plan Revision:
 - Next meeting with County and State representatives and USFS will be held on June 21 in Custer.
 - Release of final Assessments has been delayed so that they can undergo review in the Washington DC USFS office.
- o Review of Invasive Grasses Public Meeting:
 - Focus of meeting was on Ventenata, but also covered Medusahead and Cheatgrass. Ventenata is a concern for our area. Surveys for Ventenata will occur this summer along the western counties of North and South Dakota this summer.
