Scroggin noted the election went very well and thanked those involved for all of their help. Custer County voter turnout was at 42%.

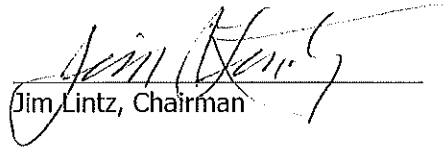
2. Motion to approve Runoff Election Canvass made by Hartman; seconded by Busskohl; vote taken, all aye; motion carried.
